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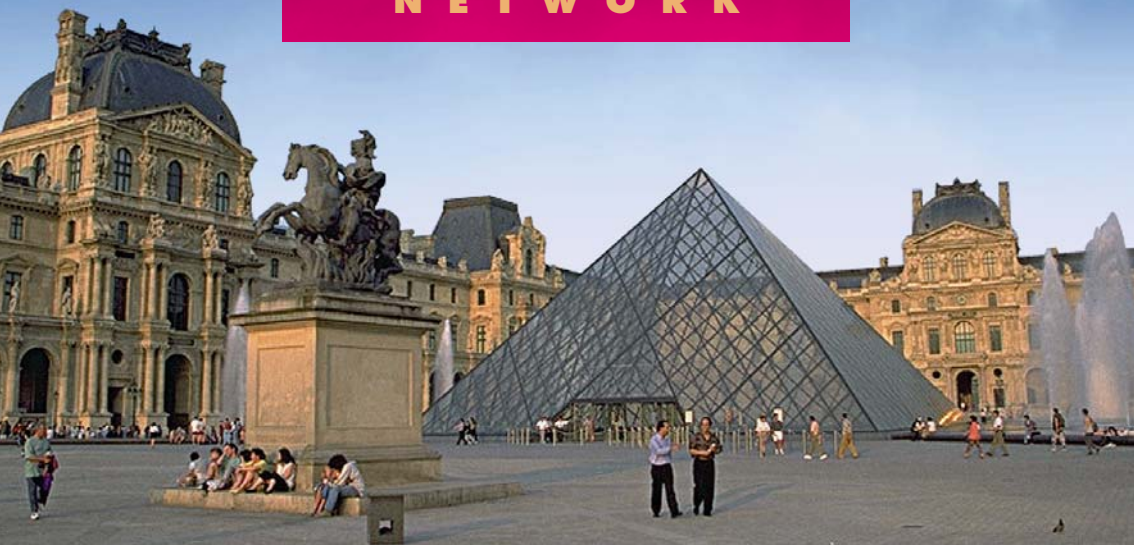

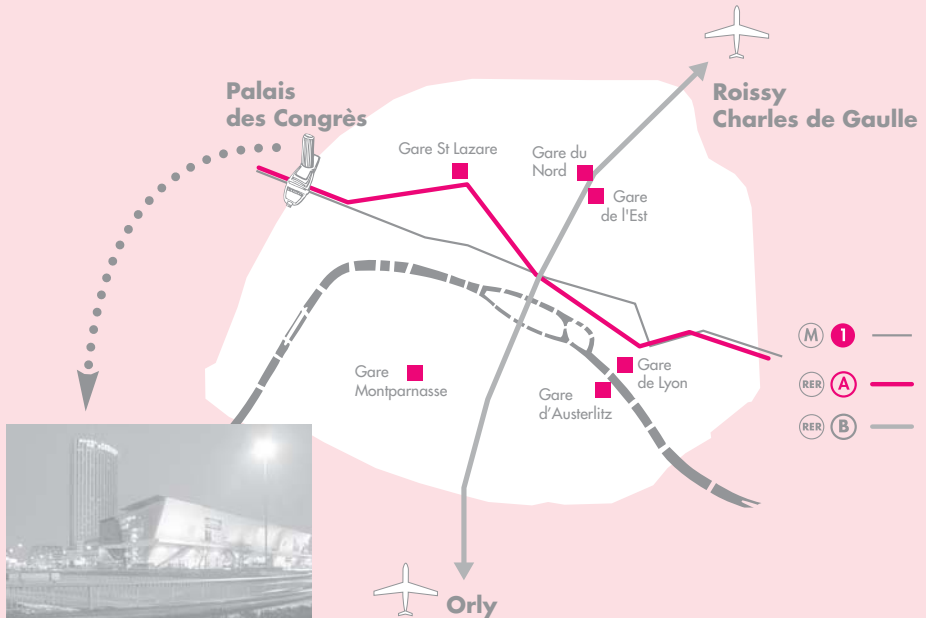

- Cancellations between March 21 and May 1, 2010: reimbursement of 50% of the fees paid,

Accommodation

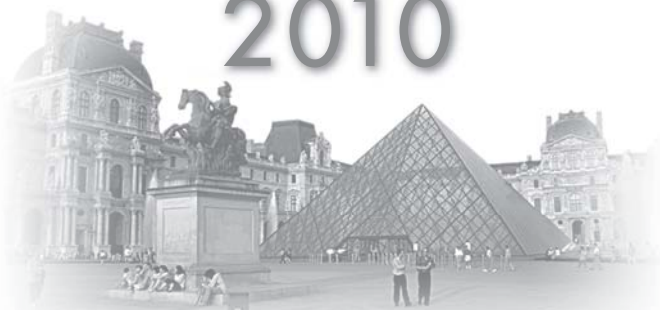
