REWARDING EXCELLENCE, INNOVATION AND COMMITMENT IN DIABETES



Call for Applications

IDF Europe is awarding **two IDF Europe Prizes in Diabetes** to reward excellence, innovation and commitment in Diabetes.

These awards aim at increasing awareness about diabetes and recognizing outstanding individuals who have dedicated themselves to improving the lives of people with diabetes.

The prizes will be awarded for Long Standing Achievement and to a Young Researcher.

Long Standing Achievement

Eligibility

The applicant

- Must be nominated by a peer and should work in Europe
- Must be an individual with a recognized outstanding voluntary work dedicated to improving the lives of people with diabetes

Young Researchers

Eligibility

The applicant

- Must be nominated by a peer and should work in Europe
- Must be a qualified health care professional aged less than 40 years
- Should be involved in innovative patient-oriented research in diabetes and its complications. The work carried out should demonstrate her/his commitment to diabetes research leading to improved health outcomes for people with diabetes

The Prizes

The winners of the 2015 edition of the IDF Europe Prizes in Diabetes will be notified of the decision of the Nominating Committee by **30 September 2015**, and will be invited to take part in the **awarding ceremony**, which will take place in the **European Parliament in Brussels or Strasbourg**.

The winners will be awarded a **10,000 EUR prize**, which will be **donated to a diabetes charity of the winners' choice**, as well as a commemorative plaque and a certificate.

The winners will also receive a **1,000 Euro honorarium**.



How to apply?

To apply, please **fill in** the IDF Europe Prize in Diabetes **application form** for the chosen category.

In addition, for both categories, the **peer** who nominates the applicant should send a **short essay** (500 words maximum) explaining the **achievements** of the individuals.

For Young Researcher, a **CV & brief report** on the outcome basic/clinical research which forms the basis for the application. The research should be carried out fully/partly in Europe. If the research has been published, a **copy of the publication** should also be sent. If not yet published, a **supporting statement** by the supervisor or Head of the Department indicating that the nominee is the principal investigator of the research. **Supporting documents** should be included in the application.
